**Solemnity of Christ the King** 

November 24th 2024

## My dear parishioners,

I hope this finds you well and adjusting to the onset of the cold weather; winter has its own beauty and its own challenges!

This weekend, with the Feast of Christ the King, we reach a solemn moment in our journey through the Church's liturgy. This year we listen to the gospel of John and we find Jesus standing before Pilate, who asks him: "Are you the King of the Jews?" I'm sure it was a new experience for Pilate, for a prisoner to reply with a question of his own: "Do you ask this of your own accord or have others spoken to you about me?" It is clear that Pilate is intrigued by Jesus and we are left with the feeling that it is Pilate who is on trial. As the dialogue moves forward we hear Pilate say, "So you are a king then", And Jesus replies: "It is you who say it. Yes, I am a King, I was born for this. I came into the world for this: to bear witness to the truth, and all who are on the side of truth listen to my voice."

What a moment for Pilate, what a moment for us listening to this gospel, and what a moment for humanity as a whole. It really is us who are on trial. Will we choose to be on the side of truth and bear witness to the truth, even when that will prove costly? This is the question which the church has faced since apostolic times and it the question of the moment: Will we bear witness to the truth of Jesus and his Gospel of Life?
