Newsletter Twenty-Fifth Sunday of the Year September 22nd 2024

My dear parishioners,

I hope this finds you and your families well as we begin the journey through the beautiful season of autumn. Nature's changing colours, so vivid and varied, remind us that change, while difficult, can also be beautiful. St. John Henry Newman was fond of saying: *to grow is to change and to have changed often is to have grown much!*

I want to thank the Spiritan Fathers from Carfin and also Fr. Johnny, chaplain to the Syro-Malabar Community here in Motherwell Diocese for their pastoral care of St. Mary's and St. Paul's while I was on holiday. I am very grateful to them for making that possible for me. I thank you also for making them warmly welcome, for they have said that was indeed the case.

As I mentioned to you I travelled to Bavaria to visit Fr. Joseph, the previous chaplain to the Syro-Malabar Community and also my good neighbour at St. Cuthbert's for almost ten years, before being asked by his Congregation to move to Germany. He lives now in a lovely small town called Pfreimd, about two hours by train, north of Munich. It was good to see him happy in his new surroundings. From there I travelled on to Rome, where I made a little personal pilgrimage and of course I remembered you and your families in my prayers. A pilgrimage to Rome usually involves a visit to the four great Basilicas, St. Peter's, St. John Lateran's, St. Mary Major's and St. Paul's Outside the Walls. Each of these beautiful churches has a Blessed Sacrament Chapel, where pilgrims are invited to pause and pray before Jesus present in the Tabernacle or indeed exposed in the Monstrance. It was good to be one of those pilgrims and to have those moments of prayer to offer thanks for you all and to pray Christ's blessing upon you and your families. My final visit was to St. Paul's Outside the Walls; in the Blessed Sacrament Chapel there is the Tabernacle of course, and then on either side, a beautiful icon of St. Mary and a very old carved wooden statue of St. Paul. It felt like a very appropriate place for me, as the parish priest of St. Mary's and St. Paul's Hamilton to bring my pilgrimage to its close. Father O'Brien
