St. Matthew's account of Jesus' ministry begins today; Matthew recognises that Jesus' location, known in his time as Galilee, but to Isaiah as Zebulun and Naphtali, fulfils the ancient prophecy about a people living in darkness seeing a great light. Jesus is this great light, the Light of the World, and he announces the Good News that the kingdom of heaven is at hand and calls everyone to repentance (literally, a change of mind), and he calls the first disciples. It is a very energetic beginning to his pastoral ministry. Jesus calls each one of us to be his disciple.
