## My dear parishioners,

This week, at our 10.30am Mass, we welcome in a special way all the families who have a son or daughter who has started school at St. Mary's Primary or at St. Paul's Primary. It has been a pleasure for me to meet the boys and girls of Primary 1 in these recent weeks and to see them happy at school, and now to welcome them here to St. Mary's for Sunday Mass.
